# Neonatal Resuscitation Program-First Golden Minute (NRP-FGM)

Neonatal resuscitation (New born resuscitation) is an emergency procedure focused on supporting newborn children who do not readily begin breathing, putting them at risk of irreversible organ injury and death. Primary focus is to prevent deaths. There are 20.3 new born deaths per 1000 live births in India (2020). To reduce the rate of neonatal deaths, Indian Academy of Paediatrics with contribution from Johnson and Johnson pvt.ltd, committed to improve health and wellbeing of children and started NRP-FGM program with a focus to train all health care team on Neonatal resuscitation.



The Apollo College of Nursing, Chittoor has taken up this responsibility to train health care team on NRP. As a part of this, we at Apollo College of Nursing, Chittoor organised NRP training program on 13th Nov 2022.

## Aim: Early initiation of breast feeding to the newborn
